

Food Transition “Pact”¹

By signing this agreement, the supplier recognizes the necessity to provide quality products for consumers that will accelerate achievement of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).² The supplier therefore agrees to establish an action plan in a minimum of three of the five pillars listed below relevant to respective activities, participate in the monitoring of its implementation and to disclose the results to the food transition hub.³

Packaging: *Limiting the environmental impact of packaging through removal of unnecessary consumer packaging and reduction of packaging volume along with clear labeling on how to recycle.*

- Ensure that all primary and secondary packaging used is reusable, recyclable or compostable

Transparency: *Applying nutriscore on food products, providing consumers with clear information on ingredient sourcing as well as the impact the manufacture and distribution of products has on the environment and society all throughout the supply chain.*

- Free and easy access to product composition
- Use of clear nutritional information and labeling

Responsible Products: *Ensuring healthy product composition and that products are sourced and produced in a manner that is sustainable.*

- Limit use of additives
- Promote the use plant-based products and develop vegetable product ranges as alternatives to animal protein
- Giving value to all the actors across the supply chain
- Limiting Food Waste across the supply chain : set an objective to Halve Food Waste by 2030
- Remove non mandatory expiration dates from products and set expiry dates based on consumer product testing with no change in pricing
- Promote healthy portion sizes adapted to the diversity of populations
- Promote foods with reduced quantities of fats, saturated fats, salt and/or sugar.
- Encourage breeders to adopt animal welfare practices and to ensure a healthy and sustainable diet for animals without GMOs
- Develop organic products that are affordable

Biodiversity: *Encouraging environmentally responsible agricultural practices*

- Limit/ensure sustainable management of the use of plant or animal products that threaten biodiversity

- Encourage producers to adopt agricultural practices that respect soil and biodiversity (organic, agroecology, regenerative agriculture, conservation ...)
- Removal GMO ingredients
- Limit pesticide use
- Implement an approach that favors the seasonality of products and encourages the purchase of local products

Climate: *Ensuring a climate-smart food system that reduces impact on the environment*

- Set a target to reduce direct and indirect emissions of CO2 emissions in line with the "science-based targets" using the Carbon Disclosure Project (CDP) guidance
- Set clear targets to reduce the use of water
- Set clear targets to reduce the use of energy and increase the use of renewable energy sources
- Set clear target to reduce waste
- Proposal of innovations or products that allow consumers to reduce their water consumption
